

TRI MET Today's Meeting Facilitation

- Facilitator for the decision process
 - Jeanne Lawson, JLA Public Involvement
- Facilitated voting process
 - The process will be based on the committee bylaws, which promise we will seek consensus
 - If consensus can't be found, then a majority vote will determine the recommendation to the TriMet Board
 - A minority report will be submitted to the TriMet Board, if needed
 - We will ensure people understand the question before a vote is taken
 - The record of the final vote will capture the position of each voting member
 - Staff will be clear with the committee about any issues that would be difficult for the TriMet Board to support.

Today's Meeting Facilitation, cont.


- Voting process
 - The facilitator will:
 - Work with the committee to identify what portions of the recommendation need to be discussed and voted on separately
 - For each portion:
 - Assess the level of committee agreement
 - Facilitate a discussion of the areas of disagreement, seeking consensus.
 - Then work with the committee to clearly articulate what the committee is going to vote on
 - Conduct a hand vote on that element, recording all positions
 - After each portion has been discussed and voted on, facilitate a roundtable vote on the whole package of recommendations.



Regional Coordination Projects



Clackamas, Multnomah & Washington County Projects

Project

SMART: Expand service to Tigard/Tualatin, Salem, Woodburn, Villebois, and growth areas; additional Saturday service; improved connections to TriMet Line 96; purchase battery electric buses

SCTD: Additional peak trips on Oregon City/CCC route and Canby route; Saturday service on Mollala route; and planning grant for master plan

SAM: Add evening trips to Gresham and Estacada lines; later service and improved coverage of in-town shopping shuttle; computer equipment/dispatch software; bus and bus stop improvements

CAT: Add Saturday service to Line 99X and dial-a-ride service; new local circulator service, including vehicles; new scheduling and vehicle technology

Clackamas County Rural: New transit hub in Government Camp; additional service on Mt. Hood Express including vehicles; transit planning

Multnomah County Rural: Expand transportation for seniors and people with disabilities; better coordination with Hood River and Columbia counties; transit planning

Washington County Rural: Additional weekday (and possible weekend) trips on WestLink service; shared ride service provided to agricultural workers; expanded demand response service; improved coordination between Tillamook, Yamhill, and Columbia counties

TRI MET Draft PTIP Outreach Themes

87% of comments generally positive towards the PTIP

Common themes:


- 160 comments about electric buses 93% positive
- 40 comments about low income fare 98% positive
- 23 comments about student transportation 57% want more funding for student transportation
- 22 comments about senior & disabled transportation 73% positive
- 15 comments about physical security improvements 100% positive

Proposed Student Support

- Allocate \$490k (1%)
- TriMet additional \$200k General Fund
- Program allocated based on % of free and reduced students at each school
- Unclaimed passes available in 2nd round
- Study Hop data to determine if more passes can be distributed with equivalent revenue forgone.
