






Timeline for STIF Plan Process

Equity Index 10 Factor Analysis:


















Equity Map Adjustments

FY26-27 Sub-Allocation Method

2.4.5 Sub-Allocation Method

Qualified Entities shall work collaboratively with Public Transportation Service Providers and other potential sub-recipients, as relevant, to develop a method for sub-allocating STIF Formula funds. Failure of a Qualified Entity to develop a sub-allocation method in collaboration with Public Transportation Service Providers and other potential sub-recipients may result in the rejection of a STIF Plan.

To the extent possible, using the best available data, the sub-allocation method used by Qualified Entities must be proportionate to the amount of employee payroll tax revenue generated within the geographic territory of each Public Transportation Service Provider. Data used to create the sub-allocation method must be shared with each Public Transportation Service Provider and other potential sub-recipients, as relevant, included in its STIF Plan. A list of potential data sources to help fulfill this requirement are contained in Appendix C.

Accessible Transportation Funds Advisory Committee (ATFAC)



Special Transportation Funds

STF (under <u>previous</u> state law)

- Established in 1985
- Funded transportation operations and capital expenses for older adults and people with disabilities
- State taxes and fees on cigarettes, ID cards, & gas
- Funds disbursed based on population
- Special Transportation Funds Advisory Committee (STFAC)
 - Citizen advisory committee which was required by the state
 - Advised the TriMet Board of Directors



Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund

STIF (under <u>newer</u> state law)

- Established in 2017 HB 2017
- Funds transit operations and capital expenses throughout Oregon
- State payroll tax of 1/10th of 1 percent
- Funds disbursed based on where payroll is generated
- HB 2017 Transit Advisory Committee
 - Citizen advisory committee required by the state
 - Advises the TriMet Board of Directors



Senate Bill 1601

SB 1601 (most recent state law changes)

- Established in 2020
- Merges old STF into newer STIF
- Old STF ceased to exist as of July 1, 2023
- STIF Formula Funds
 - STIF Payroll Based Formula Funds
 - STIF Population Based Formula Funds (includes former STF)
- Advisory Committee
 - HB 2017 Transit Advisory Committee advises the Board
 - No longer consistent with state law to have previous STFAC as an advisory committee to the TriMet Board




Accessible Transportation Funds Advisory Committee


The TriMet Board of Directors:

- Dissolved the old STFAC
- Formally established the new Accessible Transportation Funds Advisory Committee (ATFAC)
 - Advisory to the HB 2017 TAC as a "Work Group"
- Designated all current STFAC members as ATFAC members
- Adopted revised STFAC bylaws as the ATFAC bylaws
- Filled vacant non-TriMet transit provider position with Kelsey Lewis, Grants & Programs Manager, SMART




Current Committee Reporting Process
